## Check you know

$\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ conditional: if+past simple, would+infinitive (no 'to')
If it rained on the day of my party, I would feel really disappointed The possible future
$3^{\text {rd }}$ conditional: if+past perfect, would have+past participle (verb 3)
If it had rained on the day of my party last year, it would have ruined the whole day The impossible!
Hedging with verbs
Using appear and seem, and/or adding 'would'.

## Hedging with the passive

Using the passive shows that an opinion is not necessarily your own.

Hedging with noun phrases
There is little doubt that...
There is no doubt that...

There is some doubt that...
There is little evidence that...

Answer the questions
